

EUROPEAN CHAMPIONSHIPS MIXED PAIRS

The first editions of the European Mixed Pairs Championships were played in a non-official way and many of them have lost track.




The editions of 1976 and 1980 were annexed to the Olympiads and are the first under the auspices of the European Federation.




The European Mixed Championships was established in 1990, following an idea by the EBL President José Damiani.

During the Championships of Tenerife in 2001, the General Assembly and the Executive Committee of the European Federation have decided, starting in 2003, the restructuring of the *European Championships in European Teams Championships* and *European Open Championships*.




As part of the *European Open Championships* held in odd years has included a *Mixed Transnational Pairs Championships* allowed to an unlimited number of bridge players from all over the world.


